- 13% Small size

CME/OES Response - Strengths

- 38% Quality of teachers

System Weaknesses

- No system identity – Who are we?
- Teacher and administration turnover
- Poor communication between system-parents, and teacher-parents
- Implementation of updated safety and security measures
- Need sports program and more electives
- Teachers need professional development

OHS Response - Weaknesses

- 17% Teacher Turnover
- 13% Administrative Turnover
- 12% SUMMIT
- 12% Lack of challenging curriculum
- 11% Teacher Quality/Performance

OMS Response - Weaknesses

- 30% Communication
- 20% Teacher quality/retention
- 14% Lack of curriculum choices/electives

CME/OES Response - Weaknesses

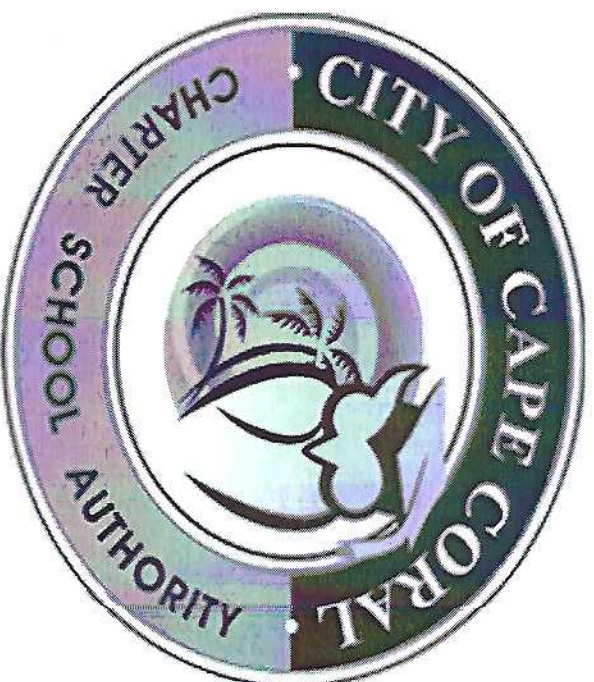
- 23% Communication between teacher-parent, administration-parent

Moving Forward

- Communication: Rediker platforms initiated and fully implemented by start of new school year.
- Teacher Quality: Upcoming schedule of year-long professional development and training; Merit Pay increases.
- Curriculum: SUMMIT adaptation and training; possible revision of implementation and scope.
- Safety and Security: Campus-wide system in place by start of new school year.
- Athletics/Exc. Activities: Create more clubs of diverse interest; promote campus-wide.
